About Faculty of Education

Teachers' Training Institute was established in 1938 under the inspiring leadership of Dr. Zakir Husain for the purpose of training teachers for Basic Schools according to the scheme of Basic Education. Later, it was renamed as Teachers' College. The College initiated Teacher Education Programme for Art and Craft Teachers and in Art Education. It also organized post graduate course in Education as well as research in Education. The status of Faculty of Education Today is an outcome of foresighted and transformation leadership of two noteworthy teacher educators, Saeed Ansari Saheb and Dr. Salamatullah - its first two Principals.

With the introduction of Faculty Structure in Jamia Millia Islamia in 1980, the erstwhile Teachers' College was renamed as Faculty of Education. At present, the Faculty of Education has two departments. The Department of Educational Studies is one of these two departments.

DES At Glance

Department of Educational Studies (erstwhile Department of Foundations of Education) was carved out of Teachers College in December 1980, and thus, became a part of the Faculty of Education. Initially the Department began its modest journey by launching two academic programs; Ph.D. (Education) and M.Ed. which were compatible with national and international standards. Department which is known today as Department of Educational Studies is an outcome of foresighted and transformational leadership of a number of teacher educators who served here with a missionary zeal.

The Department, as part of its continued effort to promote innovation through research and teaching, introduced the M.Phil. Program in 1983. The M.Phil. programme was purported to enhance students' engagement in conducting quality research. To keep abreast with the emerging trends of education, the Department introduced three more programs; M.A (Educational Planning and Administration) in 1985-86, M.Ed. (Elementary Education) program in 1997 and Post Graduate Diploma in Educational Management (PGDEM) in 2004. Significantly, all the programmes of DES except for PGDEM are research-oriented.

In response to NEP, 2020, which strongly recommended for adopting a holistic approach to school education and promoting research in Higher Education, the Department, which already had specialised programmes across levels except for pre- primary, introduced M.A. Early Childhood Development to make it more viable to the future needs. At present the Department Offers a Ph.D. in Education, M.Ed., M.A. ECD, and PGDEM.
