About Faculty of Education

Teachers' Training Institute was established in 1938 under the inspiring leadership of Dr. Zakir Husain for the purpose of training teachers for Basic Schools according to the scheme of Basic Education. Later, it was renamed as Teachers' College. The College initiated a Teacher Education Programme for Art and Craft Teachers and in Art Education. It also organized post graduate courses in Education as well as research in Education. The status of Faculty of Education Today is an outcome of foresighted and transformational leadership of two noteworthy teacher educators, Saeed Ansari Saheb and Dr. Salamatullah - its first two Principals. With the introduction of Faculty Structure in Jamia Millia Islamia in 1980, the erstwhile Teachers' College was renamed as Faculty of Education. At present, the Faculty of Education has two departments. The Department of Teacher Training and Non Formal Education (IASE) is one of these two departments.

Department of Teacher Training and Non-Formal Education (IASE)





The Department of Teacher Training & Non-Formal Education was established as a Teacher Training Institute in 1938 under the inspiring leadership of Dr. Zakir Husain in response to the need to prepare teachers for the Basic Education Scheme launched by Mahatma Gandhi in 1937. This Teacher Training Institute was perhaps the first of its kind in the country to have started training of teachers for Basic schools which were offering crafts centered indigenous education to children. The T.T.I. gradually expanded its activities and got developed into Teachers' College. T.T.I. who also took the lead in the country by offering teacher training programmes for Art Teachers in schools. The college was refurbished in its programmes and activities under the dynamic and dedicated leadership of its two great teacher educators Mr. Saeed Ansari and Dr. Salamatullah who nourished this institution until it attained the status of a Faculty of Education. In the process of reorganization of the Teacher's College and its Facultization in 1980, three departments were formed viz. Department of Teacher Training and Non Formal Education, Department of Foundations of Education and Department of Fine Arts & Art Education.

In pursuance of the recommendations of the NPE, 1986 a centrally sponsored scheme of Strengthening and Reorganization of Teacher Education was adopted by the Ministry of Human Resource Development in 1987 under which many teacher training institutions were to be strengthened and a selected number was to be upgraded to the status of Institutes of Advanced Studies in Education (IASEs). The Department of Teacher Training & Non-Formal Education of the Jamia was the first institution in the country to have been upgraded to IASE under this scheme in 1988. Obviously, this upgrade had accorded due recognition to the past services and contributions made by the Department of Teacher Training & Non-Formal Education to the cause of teacher education and had expressed the faith of the Government in the progressive traditions of this historic institution. The purpose of the upgrade is to develop the institution into a center of excellence in teaching and research. The broad functions of the Institute are: imparting pre-service and in-service education to the secondary/special education/elementary/nursery school teachers; preparing personnel for elementary teacher education institutions and their continuing education; developing and publishing for dissemination useful material for teachers and teacher-educators; and undertaking research, innovation and extension work in the field. The Institute had been carrying out most of these functions even before its up gradation as an IASE except that now there is an enhanced emphasis on continuing education. The Institute publishes quality material produced by its faculty for use by the classroom practitioners.

Department of Teacher Training & Non-Formal Education (Institute of Advanced Studies in Education) is a comprehensive Teacher Education Institution which offers the following Programmes:

- Diploma in Elementary Education (2 year) to prepares teachers for elementary schools
- B.Ed (2 year) prepares teachers for Secondary/Sr. secondary schools (at present training in 17 school teaching subjects are being offered)
- B.Ed (special Education) (2 year) prepares teachers for children with special needs: in areas of Visual Impairment & Learning Disability
- B.Ed (Nursery Education) (2 year) prepares teachers for nursery school and teacher educators for nursery / primary Education
- M.Ed (Special Education) (2 year) prepares teacher educators for Special Education in V.I. & S.L.D.
- M.A. (Education): A 2 years programme to prepare teacher educators/School Managers/Principals.
- Ph.D. Programme.

Some highlights of the programmes and activities of the Department:

- Instruction in all programmes is arranged in Urdu, Hindi, and English, and teachers produced for all the stages of school Education.
- As a unique feature, Work Experience through learning a craft has been made an integral part of teacher preparation programmes. The crafts include: (Paper craft, Gardening, Wood Work, Soft Toy making, Tie & Dye, Electrical Gadgets, Music, Interior Decoration.
- Comprehensive and continuous evaluation system is adopted to evaluate the developing teachers where due weightage is given to internal assessment.
- Lot of emphasis is given on personality development of the student teachers: NSS, co-curricular activities & games- sports are integral components of teacher preparation programmes.
- Department produces and publishes material useful for teachers and teacher educators.
- Organizes professional development programmes for teachers, teachers' educators, educational administrators, curriculum developers and others.
- Centre for all programmes in education offered by IGNOU and NIOS.
- A very competent and experienced faculty (more than 40 faculty numbers), well known all over the country. Besides teaching & training, faculty is engaged in conducting and guiding research (more than 100 Ph.D. scholars are enrolled at one time), producing teaching learning material, and contributing to various programmes organized by other premier institutions: NCERT, NCTE, CBSE, NIEPA, IGNOU, NIOS, and other institution.

Concept Note (JICE-2025)

National Educational Policy (NEP) 2020, the first policy of the 21st century, aims to transform India's education system by 2030. The policy has proposed many aspirational goals and path-breaking reforms particularly in teacher education. Teachers play a critical role in ensuring quality education and building a just, equitable, progressive, and prosperous society. The NEP 2020 emphasises multidisciplinary and holistic education, which calls for teacher education reforms in pre-service and in-service sectors. The systemic reforms are:

Diversification of Teacher Education Programmes

The duration and curricula of teacher education will be diversified:

- Four Year Integrated Bachelor of Education (ITEP) BA B.Ed./BSc B.Ed./B.Com B.Ed., covering all four levels of schooling: foundational, preparatory, middle, and secondary.
- 2 year B.Ed. for existing Bachelor's degree holders with different specialisations
- 1 year B.Ed. for those who have completed the integrated Four-Year Bachelor's degree or those who have completed Master's in any specialised field.

Training for PhD Entrants

• All fresh PhD entrants, irrespective of discipline, are required to take credit-based courses in teaching/ education/ pedagogy/ academic writing related to their specific PhD subject, along with having minimum hours of teaching experience.

Establishment of Multidisciplinary Institutions

- All teacher education programmes to be conducted within composite multidisciplinary institutions to ensure integration and quality.
- Only educationally sound multidisciplinary and integrated teacher education programmes to be made available.

Availability of Quality Programmes

- NTA(NCET) testing for admission to B.Ed.
- Merit scholarship for 4 years ITEP
- Stringent action against substandard standalone Teacher Education Institutions
- Setting up of *National Mission for Mentoring* with a large pool of outstanding senior/retired faculty
- National Higher Education Regulatory Council (NHERC) to function as a single point regulator for the higher education sector, including teacher education.
- Teacher Eligibility Test will be for all levels of schooling.

These reforms aim to build a robust foundation for teacher education, aligning with NEP 2020's vision of creating a globally competitive and inclusive education system.

To navigate the transition envisaged in the policy, educators and institutions involved in teacher education must adapt to the new policy directives and prepare for the evolving teaching landscape. A three-day international conference "NEP 2020 and Transformative Teacher Education Trajectories" is being organised to discuss the changes needed considering NEP 2020.

This conference will serve as a significant milestone in bridging research, policy, and practice to strengthen teacher education. We look forward to fostering meaningful discussions and

Guidelines for Paper Submission

Authors are requested to adhere to the following guidelines before submitting their papers to JICE-2025:

- 1. Only original papers which have never been published or sent for publication to any other publisher will be accepted.
- 2. Use Times New Roman for the entire manuscript with specific font sizes for different parts and headings of the paper (as given below).
- 3. Word limit for the full paper: 2500 to 3000 words (Maximum 10 to 12 Pages)
- 4. Title of the Paper: Font 14, Center text and **Bold**
- 5. Abstract: Font 12, *Italics*, word limit-around 200 words
- 6. Key words: 5 to 7
- 7. All headings with font size 13 in **bold**
- 8. All subheadings in font size 12 in **bold**
- 9. Body text/running text in font 12 un-bold
- 10. Conclusion/Summary: Font 12, Italics, 200 to 300 words
- 11. References and Bibliography: APA 7th edition format
- 12. Diagrams/graphs/figures: Properly placed and cited in the text with figure labels/description at the bottom of the diagram/graphs/figures/sketches etc.
- 13. Tables: Properly placed and cited in the text with table number and labels at the top of the table.
- 14. The factual information adopted from any of the published documents must be cited with source. In addition, this citation must be referred to in detail in the reference list.
- 15. Name of the contributor(s), designation, institutional affiliation, mobile number, and email-id must be given properly, preferably on the first sheet of the paper.
- 16. Copyright issues must be taken care of. The manuscript must not have plagiarism more than 10% (as per UGC Guidelines).
- 17. Authors are required to submit a Certificate of Originality and Copyright Transfer Certificate to the publisher/editor(s), in the given format (Page-12).
