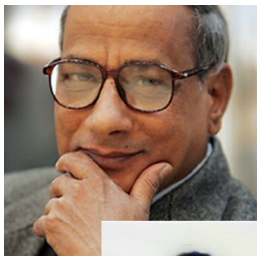

Born in Rio de Janeiro, Marco Lucchesi studied History at the Federal University of Fluminense, and received his doctorate in Science of Literature from the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro and post-doctorate in Philosophy of Renaissance from the University of Cologne, Germany. He edited Tempo Brasileiro, Poesia Sempre, and Mosaico Italiano and currently edits the Revista Brasileira da ABL. He has translated, among others, Umberto Eco, Rûmî, Hölderlin, Juan de la Cruz and Rilke. He has authored many award-winning books and taught in several universities of

the world.



Mangalesh Dabral, Sahitya Academy Award winner, is an eminent poet and journalist. His poetry has been translated into various Indian and foreign languages. He has edited prestigious newspaper *Jansatta* and various literary magazines.

Anisur Rahman is a poet, translator and educationist. He has translated profusely from Urdu to English and vice-versa. He taught English literature at Jamia Millia Islamia, where he also served at various administrative positions. He is related to Rekhta, an Urdu cultural movement.



Savita Singh, a poet and political theorist has four collections of poetry published. She is a recipient of Hindi Academy Award and prestigious Raza Award for poetry. She is currently Professor in School of Gender and Development Studies, Indira Gandhi National Open University, Delhi.
