<b>Walkable City</b>	A city that accommodates all age groups; reduces gender conflicts; and respects disabilities Supportive infrastructure for transportation.
<b>Bicycling City</b>	Mainstreaming bicycling as a commuter mode. Should Delhi's planning vision and policies strive to discourage driving"?
<b>Creative City</b>	in 2004, the UNESCO, Creative Cities Network (UCCN) was created to strengthen cooperation with and among cities that have recognized <b>creativity</b> as a strategic factor of sustainable development as regards to economic, social, cultural environmental aspects & climate change
<b>Socially Transformative City</b>	<i>How should future cities look?</i> The tone of the session will be set by the video, "Organizing for Change: Workers in the Informal Economy". It also features the benefits of organizing with case studies from Ghana, India and Thailand.
<b>Gender Supportive Cities</b>	Creating a strong gender support is critical in ensuring inclusive cities around the world because in most instances, women bear the burden of socio-economic disparities and the lack of access to resources force them to be entrenched in cycles of poverty.
<b>Water Inclusive Cities</b>	Water is needed in cities where it is not always available. Owing to the rapid growth of cities and poor management of urban water and waste, resulting extensive degradation of the urban environments including natural water bodies, rivers, wetlands, etc. effecting human health & survival. The session will discuss the role of water in cities & its management practices.
