"Allotment of Residential Accommodation"**

10	<p>(v) The out of turn allotment of a house to the handicapped employees will be applicable in the following conditions:</p> <p>(a) The blind, i.e. those who suffer from total absence of sight.</p> <p>(b) The deaf, having total loss of hearing in both ears.</p> <p>(c) The orthopedic ally handicapped, to the extent of 60% and above disability.</p> <p>(d) Mentally handicapped/spastic dependants.</p>	<p>(v) The allotment on medical ground including ground floor/central area Shall be made in the case of the Government servants and their spouses, dependent children and dependent parents, suffering from any of the following diseases:</p> <p>(a) Tuberculosis: Pulmonary tuberculosis (serious case only).</p> <p>(b) Cancer Cases: Malignant neoplasm.</p> <p>(c) Heart ailments: of an exceptionally serious nature and in need of urgent treatment.</p> <p>(d) Disabled persons:</p> <p>(1) Blind : Those who suffer from either of the following conditions.</p> <p>(i) Total absence of sight.</p> <p>(ii) Visual Acuity not exceeding 6/90 or 20/200 (snellen) in the better eye with correcting lenses.</p> <p>(iii) Impression of the field of vision subtending an angle of 20 degree or worse.</p> <p>(2) Deaf : Those having hearing loss of more than 90 decibels in the better ear (profound impairment) of total loss of hearing in both ears.</p> <p>(3) Orthopedically handicapped: To the extent of 40% and above disability.</p> <p>(4) Mentally handicapped/spastic dependants.</p>

		<p>Note (1) The list of diseases on the basis of which discretionary allotment may be considered as above, is not an exhaustive one. The Committee may consider any other life threatening diseases or other serious disabilities causing permanent impairment, for this purpose.</p> <p>Note (2) In cases where disability of dependent parents is the sole ground for asking for discretionary allotment, the Committee should consider the facts and circumstances along with merits of each case carefully, before making their recommendations.</p>
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
