- 4. Write a short note on steps taken to achieve gender equality at the global level.
- 5. Explain the role of a teacher during classroom interactions. How can teachers ensure that gender stereotypes are done away with? Give examples.
- 6. What is the relation between self-esteem and depression? What role can the school or teachers play in checking depression amongst students?

- 2. Discuss the importance and significance of Right of Person with Disability 2016 in detail.
- 3. Define Learning Disability. Discuss its causes, characteristics and educational programmes.
- 4. Highlight the barriers to achieve the goals of inclusive education. Discuss the remedies to overcome these barriers for successful inclusion.
- 5. What makes a school inclusive? What are the key steps to manage children with special need in inclusive school?

- 1. What are the merits and demerits of using computers? Discuss in detail.
- 2. What are the implications of OER for teaching and learning?
- 3. Briefly explain the scope of ICT and assess its use a democratic tool.
- 4. Discuss the impact of ICT on students' motivation to study.
- 5. What roles do teachers play in a constructivist learning environment?

Understanding the Self

2. List the qualities that you feel are desirable and undesirable in your personality. What measures have you taken to remove the undesirable qualities in you?

3. Watch any movie of your choice. Discuss the nature and personality attributes of the main character in the movie. Also, discuss the relationship of that character with his/er family, friends or colleagues.

4. Read any autobiography and write its review in your own words. Also, write a critical appraisal of the autobiography.

5. Prepare a plan and conduct a guidance and counseling session with the students of any class. You may select the topic of the session according to the age and issues concerning the students of the class.

- 1. Evaluate the current state of vocational education in India in light of globalization. What are the strengths and weaknesses of the existing system, and how can it be improved to better meet the demands of the global workforce?
- 2. Examine the role of vocational education in bridging the gender gap in the Indian workforce. What specific measures can be taken within vocational education programs to address gender disparities and promote equal opportunities for women?
- 3. Discuss the significance of soft skills, such as communication and time management, in vocational education. How can these skills be effectively taught and assessed within a vocational training program?
- 4. In the context of vocational education, what is the importance of understanding diverse cultural perspectives in the workplace? How can students be prepared to navigate intercultural interactions and build inclusive work environments?

- 4. Describe what Yoga is in an easy way, focusing on both its artistic and scientific sides. Explain how practicing yoga can help prevent and manage diseases related to our lifestyles.
- 5. What are the key principles for planning and organizing sports facilities? List the key points to consider when creating sports facilities that are accessible and safe for people with disabilities.

- 3. Analyse the "Education for Peace as a Lifestyle Movement" concept. How can this idea be practically implemented in schools and communities?
- 4. Analyse the role of human rights in fostering peace education. How does the Universal Declaration of Human Rights contribute to peace?
- 5. Propose a plan to integrate peace education into the school curriculum. What challenges might arise and how would you address them?

- 3. Compare and contrast directive and non-directive approaches in counselling. How do the counsellor's roles differ in each approach, and what are the implications for the client's experience?
- 4. Discuss the main challenges faced in providing effective guidance and counseling in a distance education setting. How can counselors address these challenges to support remote learners?
- 5. Describe the main differences between projective and non-projective psychological techniques. How does each approach contribute to understanding an individual's personality?
