- The specialization of clinical and counseling psychology, organizational behavior, and advanced diploma in counseling psychology has made a tremendous contribution in producing trained/professional psychologists.

51. Detail any five Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Challenges (SWOC) of the department:

Strengths:

1. The vigor of the department is evident in its successful implementation in the preceding four years of the semester mode across all courses offered in the department. In line with the thrust area, that is, Health and Well-Being of the DRS Phase-II (under UGC-SAP), the syllabi of the bachelors and masters programme were revised and reworked in consultation with the academicians of national institutions of repute. Further, keeping in view the advancements and relevance in the discipline, the specialization of Counseling Psychology was introduced as part of the Masters programme.
2. The department embraces participatory, experiential, discursive and student-centric practices, in its teaching-learning endeavors. Further, research-oriented, competent and student-focused faculty adds to the strength and potency of the department.
3. Dynamism in research-related activities is evident in the research publications, projects and practices undertaken by the department and faculty. The DRS-II (under UGC-SAP) research programme (2013-2018), focuses on health and well-being. Further, an international project under the UGC-UKIERI Thematic Partnership programme (2014-2016) is undertaken by two faculty members. Three ICSSR sponsored national projects on diverse themes have also been successfully completed and submitted.
4. A visible strength of the department is field training and project work as part of course curriculum. Such field/project work aid students in putting their theoretical knowledge of the

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discipline into practice. Additional values added purpose of subject in organizing various occasions.

5. The existence of a participatory style of academic and administrative functioning adds vigor to the department. Faculty improvement programmes such as orientation and refresher courses, extension lectures, organization and attendance of conferences, seminar, workshop, symposia, etc., are encouraged.
6. The department has been instrumental in facilitating various government schemes and agencies. Faculty participation in selection committees and recruitment of personnel in government organizations.
7. The Subject Association of the department is proactive in engaging students to be active constituents of the university and society. Faculty-student marches to create awareness of issues in mental health, services such as counseling and psychological testing to the community in the university, nukkad nataks, amongst others were undertaken. Overall development of the students is undertaken through the organization of debates, quizzes, sporting activities, etc.

Weaknesses:

1. Lack of better infrastructural facilities, such as state-of-the art laboratories, classrooms, seminar rooms/library and technologies for students and for teachers impedes effective teaching-learning process.
2. Inadequate physical space for students and faculty members.
3. Maintenance of internet facilities, access to many online journals and other e-learning resources is limited in comparison to other educational institutions in Delhi.
4. Students with special needs, such as advanced learners, learning disabled, differently abled etc., are not provided with adequate and appropriate facilities.

Opportunities:

1. With sound curriculum, the pursuance of upcoming areas, like Neuro-Psychology, Health Psychology, Military Psychology, Forensic Psychology, Sports Psychology, Consumer Behavior, etc., would open viable employment oriented opportunities for students by other educational, mental health institutions and hospitals.
2. There is scope for better opportunities both for faculty and students to liaison at national and international levels, such as the ongoing UGC-UKIERI research collaboration in the department.
3. Recognition and honing of creative talents of students that contributes to life development skills.
4. The application of brain mapping, EMG, biofeedback, latest testing instruments, and software packages in teaching and research would enhance the employability of students and development of faculty.

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5. Excellence in research by faculty can be achieved through academic flexibility.

Challenges:

1. Provision of academic flexibility and development of job-oriented skills.
2. Bridging the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical application of the discipline and inability to tap different emerging areas and thrusts in psychology.
3. Active liasoning with external agencies and alumni.
4. Provision of adequate physical facilities, medical services, conveyance, etc., to students and teachers alike.
5. Attracting and retaining world-class students and faculty, fostering global competencies in students and contribution to national and global development.
6. Establishing state of the art laboratories and other research facilities at par with other higher learning institutions to students and faculty alike, and introduction of interdisciplinary courses and emerging thrust areas in the discipline.

52. Future plans of the department:

1. In line with the thrust area of DRS Phase-II (under UGC-SAP), the department plans to introduce an integrated Ph.D program in health and well-being and M. Phil in clinical and courses in emerging areas of neuro-psychology, military psychology, sports psychology, forensic/criminal and professional psychology.
2. Designing short term skill based programs/modules for psychological empowerment of weaker/minority sections of society, especially women and children. To provide community related services to the neighboring areas surrounding the university, specifically in the area of health, well-being and counseling.
3. Infrastructure development (faculty rooms, laboratories, class rooms, state of the art seminar/classroom, computer lab & availability of wide range of tests/computer assisted testing, software, books, Journals etc.) is required.
4. To focus on local, national and international funding/collaboration in research and teaching and promote interdisciplinary/collaborative research.
5. Analyze the need/trend of placement in applied areas of discipline and strengthen the partnership between Industry/prospective employer and student.
