












WHAT IS A BAOLI (STEPWELL)

- Stepwells (or baoli) are wells or ponds with a long corridor of steps that descend to the water level.
- Stepwell played a significant role in defining subterranean architecture in western India from 7th to 19th century





WHY LODHIS BUILT THIS MONUMENT

Baoli's were built to be both a ground water source and a collection tank to store rain water that can be used throughout the year

HOW SOCIETY IS BENEFITTED

Baoli's in villages were mainly used for Utilitarian purposes and social gatherings whereas on trade route they were often used as resting place












BAOLI AT WAZIRPUR KA GUMBAD

The Baoli at Wazirpur ka Gumbad, a Lodhi-Era ASI protected structure is one of the 14 baolis in Delhi. It's architectural ambience is very captivating and appealing which makes it a must visit hidden gems of Delhi. It comprises of five tombs, a prayer wall (Qanati masjid), some grave platforms, a step well and a well.
















Baoli at Wazirpur ka Gumbad



- The Baoli at wazirpur ka Gumbad was built between years 1451-1526
- It was the main source of water for the people of Munirka Village
- The Structure was built during the era of one of the three lodhi sultan that is Bahlul lodhi or Sikandar lodhi or Ibrahim lodhi












GEOGRAPHICAL ASPECTS


SPATIO-TEMPORAL ANALYSIS

At its time of construction the baoli was the main source of water for the people living at nearby

Munirka village.

RECONNECT-REIMAGINE

At the top edge of the well there is an open sloppy aqueduct from which water can run down a few feet. The material and the style suggest that it was built much later for convenience of locals.

At present the Baoli is dry and its purpose have changed from being a water source to a chilling spot for locals.

Structure of the Baoli

The Most striking element of this baoli is iits design.

Two turrets at the southern end stand in the edge of the well with narrow winding staircase

It has four approaches, two from the turrets, and two towards the sidewalls of the baoli









The platform has two arches in the middle opposite to each other

One arch opens towards the well, and the other arch towards the tank.

The baoli has only two tiers, and was filled with earth till the early 20th century.

REJUVENATE


There are several cracks on the Structure.

Recharging the aquifer by rain water harvesting would help in reviving the Waterbody. Public awareness program and photo walks should be conducted to create awareness among public.

















Baoli at Wazirpur ka Gumbad







Wazirpur Gumbad complex stands gracefully between the modern-day gurudwara and the mandir, giving a perfect example of communal coexistence.

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






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
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Plan for Redevelopment of the complex




Public Restrooms

Lamp posts across the perimeter for night visibility.







The main tomb has two entrances, two graves, and one winding stair case on the southwest corner.

Since 2016, some locals have started offering flowers and sweets at the graves in the main tomb of the complex. Since the burial tombs are of anonymous people, local devotees have given them the title of 'Pir Baba'.
