



# CALL FOR APPLICATIONS CHARPAK LAB SCHOLARSHIP 2021

The Embassy of France in India is inviting applications for **Charpak Lab Scholarship 2021**. This program is designed for Indian students enrolled in an Indian institution at the Bachelor's or Master's levels, planning to undertake a training/research project at a French laboratory or university during their academic break (between May and July).

### BENEFITS

The scholarship will be awarded for a duration of **2 months between May and July 2021**. The scholarship covers the following benefits:

- monthly stipend of 700 euros
- · student visa and Etudes en France fee waiver

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

The applicant must:

- be an Indian national residing in India at the time of application
- not be more than 30 years old at the time of application
- be currently enrolled in an Indian institution of higher learning at Bachelor's/Master's level
- be in possession of an admission/acceptance letter from a French laboratory or institution where the research internship/project will be carried out.
- the duration of the research internship/project must not be less than 1 month and should not exceed 2 months. If the duration exceeds 2 months, the awardees will have to cover the expenses by themselves.

### SELECTION PROCEDURE

The awardees will be selected on the basis of academic excellence as well as the consistence and quality of the statement of purpose. There is no CGPA/ Percentage cut off for the scholarship. Knowledge of French language will be an asset but it is not mandatory.

# CALL FOR APPLICATIONS CHARPAK MASTER'S SCHOLARSHIP 2021

The Embassy of France in India is inviting applications for Charpak Master's Scholarship 2021. This scholarship is designed for one to two years (September - June, 10 months per academic year) of studies in France at the Master's degree level for all streams and fields of study.

### BENEFITS:

- Monthly living allowance of 700 euros
- Student visa and Etudes en France fee waiver
- Tuition fee waiver upto 5000 euros
- Assistance to find affordable accommodation (priority access to CROUS residencies, subject to availability)

# **ELIGIBILITY**: The applicant must

- be an Indian national and reside in India
- be 30 years old maximum at the time of application
- be a student currently enrolled/have studied at an Indian Institution of higher learning or a young professional employed in a company for a maximum of 3 years at the time of application
- the course must take place in France. If you have one semester or more of studies in another country, the scholarship will not be provided during that period.
- an exception will be made for Charpak scholarship holders who are currently completing their M1 in France. They may re-apply for a second year of funding in order to complete their M2. There is no automatic renewal of the scholarship at the M2 level. Acceptance will be subject to academic performance at the M1 level and a new statement of purpose.
- non-scholarship holders currently pursuing M1 in France are not eligible for the scholarship.

## SELECTION PROCEDURE:

The applications will be selected on the basis of academic excellence as well as the consistence and quality of the candidate's statement of purpose. There is no CGPA/ Percentage cut off for the scholarship. Knowledge of French language will be an asset but it is not mandatory.
