JMI hosts International Conference on "Dara Shukoh: Cultural Pluralism & Religious Syncretism"

A two-day International Conference on "Dara Shukoh: Cultural Pluralism & Religious Syncretism" began today at Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI). The conference is being organized by the Nelson Mandela Centre for Peace and Conflict Resolution (NMCPCR), JMI in collaboration with Centre for Persian and Central Asian Studies, SLL & CS, Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) and Dara Shukoh Research Foundation (DSRF) on November 28 & 29, 2024.

His eloquent speech captivated the audience as he highlighted the character of Dara Shukoh and elaborated on his contributions. Additionally, he discussed the rich tapestry of India's inclusive culture, emphasizing that the nation not only embraced various religions and their adherents but also allowed them to thrive.
