The event was chaired by Prof Manisha Tripathy Pandey, Hony. Director, CNESPR.



He talked about the tribal customary laws, dispute resolution, community participation in Jhum cultivation and traditional healing practices incorporating elements of herbal medicines and spirituality. He emphasised moving beyond the 'colonised minds' to have an open perspective about tribal knowledge systems and their ways of life.




CNSEPR will continue to facilitate dialogue and nuanced understanding on topics of importance to the region and the nation at large.
