JMI successfully conducts admission tests for Classes IX and VI for the session 2025-26

Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI) successfully conducted its entrance tests yesterday for admissions to classes VI and IX for which a record number of 23,000 applications were received. The high number of applications received set a new record in itself. Significantly, the admission tests were conducted in various cities-- Srinagar, Kolkata, Patna, Lucknow and Delhi.

With over 90% attendance on an average, approximately 22,000 candidates appeared in the entrance tests at various centres across the country. In what is being seen as a big relief to students and their parents, nearly 7,000 applicants appeared in the admission tests from their nearest hometowns, namely, Srinagar, Kolkata, Patna, Lucknow.

Vice-Chancellor JMI Prof. Mazhar Asif, Registrar Prof. Md. Mahtab Alam Rizvi, Deputy Controller of Examinations Dr. Ahteshamul Haque, Security Advisor (Retd. DCP) Syed Abdul Rashid visited the test centres and interacted with students and their parents. Expressing their satisfaction with the arrangements at the multiple test centres, the university authorities congratulated the admission team of the Office of the Controller of Examinations (CoE), JMI for their hard work and meticulous planning that ensured the smooth conduct of the entrance tests of such a large scale. Notably, the entire test was conceived and conducted in-house by the admission team of CoE office and team of FTK- CIT, without any third party, ensuring the highest level of confidentiality, transparency and fairness.

The tests were conducted at Kendriya Vidyalayas outside JMI to conform to transparency and to ensure that no compromise was made in the conduct and quality of the test.

The admission team of the Office of CoE had been working day and night, along with JMI teaching faculty members and non-teaching staff who served as Centre observers, superintendents, invigilators, besides, security teams which were deployed for the test. Delhi Police personnel and Delhi traffic police also provided full support in managing the crowd and the traffic within JMI campus, given the large number of test takers for this academic year.
