JMI's Faculty of Dentistry organises three-day scientific workshop titled "The Art and Science of Health Research"

New Delhi: The Faculty of Dentistry (FoD), Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI), successfully organized a three-day scientific workshop titled "The Art and Science of Health Research" from March 3 to 5, 2025 at the FTK-CIT Conference Hall of the university. This workshop was conducted as part of the training and capacity building initiative under the research project NIHR Global Health Group on Oral Health. The main aim of the workshop was to equip early and mid career researchers and academicians with essential skills in health research methodologies. The workshop was organized by Prof. Abhishek Mehta, Professor in Public Health Dentistry and Principal Investigator of the project.

The workshop witnessed active participation from 150 attendees, including faculty members, Department Heads, postgraduate and undergraduate students from various institutions from different parts of India. on defining research problems and questions. Prof. Priyanka Kapoor from FoD, JMI, led a session on literature search methodologies, and Dr. Nitika Monga from ICMR, New Delhi, conducted a workshop on research proposal writing. Ethical considerations in health research were addressed by Dr. Sujata Sinha, Scientist D, Department of Health Research, Govt. of India, followed by hands-on training on reference management tools by Prof. Aman Chowdhry from FoD, JMI. Additionally, Prof. Shyam Sivasamy from Meenakshi Amal Dental College & Hospital, Chennai, delivered sessions on questionnaire design, sample size calculation, and quantitative data analysis.

Attendees appreciated the engaging sessions, the opportunity to interact with esteemed experts, and the hands-on approach that made complex research concepts more accessible.
